Dear Candidate,

This letter is to remind you about placement of campaign signs along county roads. I understand that your campaign signs are important, and you want to place them at locations with good visibility, which might mean in the right-of-way on a county road, but placing the signs in the right-of-way becomes a problem for my department. Please **DO NOT place a campaign sign on the county right-of-way that the WCHD maintains and/or mows**. The employees of the WCHD have been instructed to remove any campaign (and/or any other) signs that are placed in the right of way along any county road during mowing season. The employees that operate mowers cannot mow around signs nor can they dismount from the mower to move and/or replace a sign. Therefore, the WCHD procedure has been to remove the signs placed in the right-of-way.

Campaign signs will not be removed from an individual's yard that they maintain to the road. In yards where the owner mows to the road, we have no need to remove that sign. The signs in the right-of-way that impede mowing will be removed. Also, any sign that blocks the visibility of motorists will be moved to create better visibility, but this rarely happens, and it typically is not a problem.

It might not seem like mowing season just yet, but it will be upon us before we know it and with your help and consideration, the mowing process will be smoother, and you will eliminate your campaign signs from being removed. Good luck with your campaign.
